Did you have to do any assessments to figure out what you were eligible for?

It wasn't like super invasive but, like, kind of.

You're not allowed to have people over. I don't really like the whole get up at 6:30 thing.

They search your bags every time that you come in and out.

I understand it, but it's a little invasive.

I didn't end up getting housing with them. It was a really long list.

Stuff like that was a little bit ridiculous, I think.

What's it like to work with them and to try to use their services?

They seem like they were really helpful, they just seem like they have a lot on their plates.

I feel like they look at everybody the same, almost.

Like, some people actually do just want housing, you know what I mean?

You definitely can't get clean and fix yourself living like this.

[10 minutes] Have you ever used the shelters here? Yeah, I stayed at the in the winter. V wasn't down here. And then we stayed at the overflow a couple of weeks ago. If you go there as a couple, then they let you stay there. We have a tent; it's just we're not allowed to have them up in the day. So, you set it up every night? Pretty much, yeah. It was really cold. [15 minutes] When you went to jail, how did your relationship with end? I just kind of lost touch with them. Did you ever hear from them? Well, I haven't had a phone again. I had a phone and then I didn't. People lose them or they get stolen. [20 minutes]

When you're trying to live outside, it doesn't really leave a lot of time to try to find housing.

Every time you go anywhere you have to take everything with you.

or [have] people watch your stuff and then having a bunch of shit go missing.

It's just stupid stuff like that every day.

You can't really trust many people, unfortunately.

What do you think the solution to that is?

I just heard the other day there's a storage area.

If you get a hold of this person, they can put some stuff in storage there for you.

I actually just heard about that yesterday or the day before.

It's just talking to people.

Yeah, that's mainly how I found out about stuff.



Are you mostly searching for housing in the private market? Or how are you looking for housing now?

In the wintertime I was going to the library all the time.

I was going on Kijiji.

Mainly the higher end, more expensive ones.

Even just for a room sometimes it's 800 bucks.

But the first place, we were literally just driving around and saw the sign in the window.

A lot of it's who you know too.
